### ACROSS THE STATE



Public Charities employ 1 million Texans, and support the employment of an additional **224,000 Texans** through indirect and induced economic effects



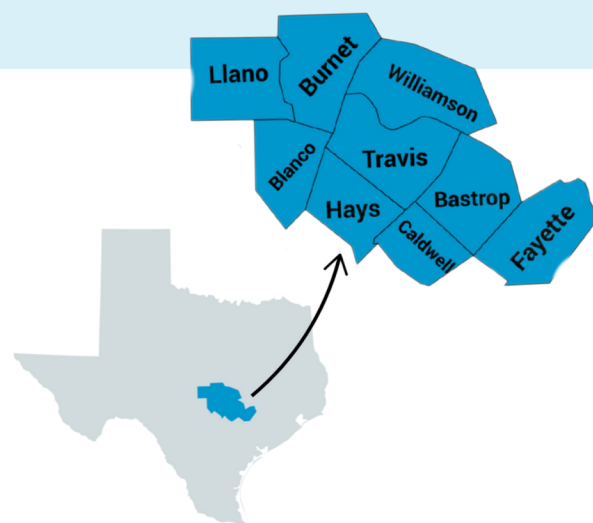
Public charities throughout Texas spent **\$96 billion** in 2019, and contributed an additional **\$41 billion** to the state's economy through indirect and induced effects



that's an additional **\$0.43** for every dollar spent by nonprofits

### THE AUSTIN REGION

- **\$7.6 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$3.9 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.51** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **19,400 Texans**



### THE DALLAS/FORT WORTH REGION

- **\$33.9 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$15.8 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.46** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **80,000 Texans**

## The Nonprofit Sector's Impact on the Economy



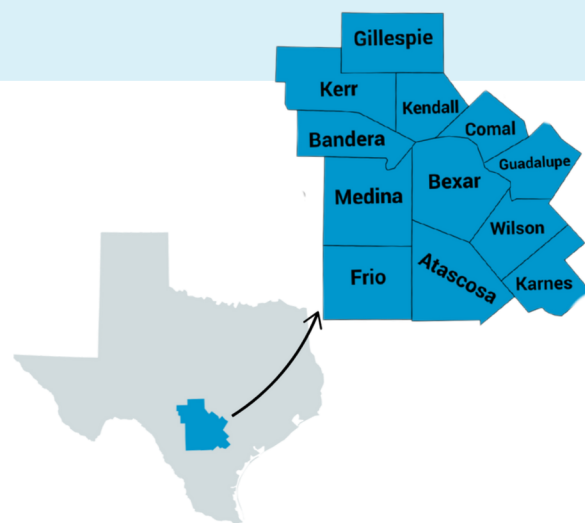
### THE HOUSTON REGION

- **\$29.4 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$12.0 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.41** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **65,300 Texans**



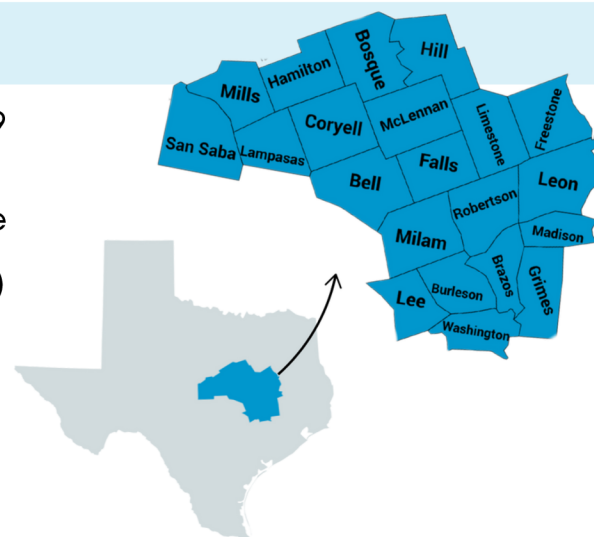
### THE SAN ANTONIO REGION

- **\$6.7 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$3.0 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.46** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **8,800 Texans**



### THE CENTRAL REGION

- **\$3.3 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$1.1 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.34** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **7,600 Texans**

## The Nonprofit Sector's Impact on the Economy



### THE EAST REGION

- **\$5.5 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$1.8 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.33** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **11,700 Texans**



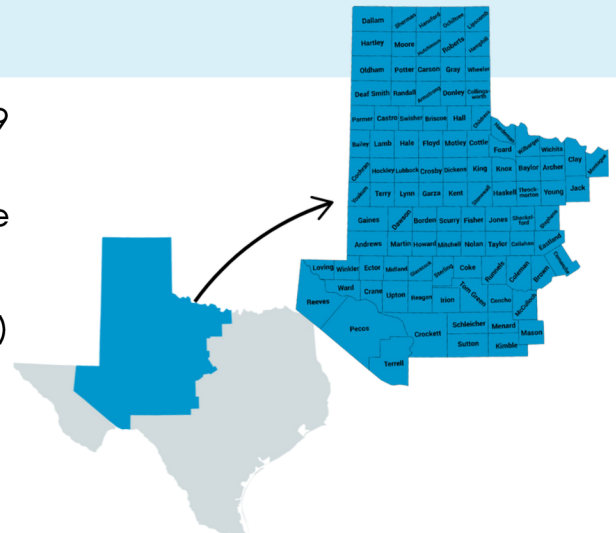
### THE SOUTH REGION

- **\$5.4 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$1.9 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.36** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **13,800 Texans**



### THE WEST REGION

- **\$4.2 billion** spent by public charities in 2019
- **\$1.4 billion** in additional impact on the state (an additional **\$0.34** for each dollar spent)
- Supports the employment of an additional **8,100 Texans**
